## INTRODUCTION

A devoted personality, Dr. Banarsi Dass Soni, Ex. Capt. I.M.S., with a missionary zeal for medical education and patient care, conceived the noble idea of providing the much-needed medical care to the general public. This bloomed in the form of Arya Medical School in 1934. It was started in a rented building in Civil Lines, Ludhiana. In the beginning, admission was limited to only 20 students.

In 1936, management of the school was handed over to the Arya Samaj, Saban Bazar, Ludhiana, under the aegis of Arya Pratinidhi Sabha, Punjab. A separate Managing Body nominated by the Managing Committee of Arya High School, Ludhiana managed the Medical School. It was shifted to its own building (presently, Dayanand Medical College & Hospital, College Campus, Ludhiana) in 1937.

The medical school was recognized for LSMF (Licentiate of State Medical Faculty) in 1938 and also for the running hospital attached to it. The following year, the Managing Body decided that the Ludhiana Medical School should, in future, be called "Arya Medical School" and the hospital attached to it "Dayanand Hospital".

It was only in 1964 that, consistent with the policy of the Government, Arya Medical School flowered into a full-fledged MBBS College, which came to be known as Dayanand Medical College. The management of this college was taken over by a galaxy of prominent people of Ludhiana, who formed an organization known as the "Managing Society of Dayanand Medical College & Hospital, Ludhiana", and Late Shri H.R. Dhanda, a prominent industrialist of the town, became its Founder-President.

The college is recognized for the MBBS Course by the Medical Council of India and is affiliated to the Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot. It admits 70 students every year to the MBBS Course.

The college is also affiliated to the Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot for the postgraduate courses in Anatomy, Anesthesiology, Dermatology & STD, Medicine, Microbiology, Obstetrics & Gynecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Otolaryngology, Pathology, Pediatrics, Pharmacology, Physiology, Psychiatry and Community Medicine (S.P.M.), Radio-diagnosis, Surgery. All these courses have been recognized by the Medical Council of India.

The institution also imparts training for D.M. Courses in Cardiology and Gastroenterology as well as for M.Ch. Courses in Plastic Surgery. The process of seeking permission to start D.M. (Neurology) and M.Ch. (Urology) has been set in motion.

DMCH College of Nursing is one of the most modern and well-equipped nursing colleges of Punjab, with excellent on-job training. It imparts training for General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) and B.Sc. (Nursing). It plans to introduce a post-basic course in near future.

The super-specialties of Cardiology, Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery, Endocrinology, Gastroenterology, G.E. Surgery, Kidney Transplant, Nephrology, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Medical Oncology, Surgical Oncology, Pediatric Surgery, Plastic Surgery including micro-vascular surgery, Transfusion Medicine and Urology are providing the most modern and advanced care to the patients. All these super-specialties are managed by highly qualified doctors, who have, at their disposal, the latest sophisticated investigative and treatment facilities. The prominent state of the art investigative facilities available in DMCH include Fiberoptic Endoscopes including upper as well as lower GI Scopes, Bronchoscopes, Nasopharyngolaryngoscope, Colposcope, Hysteroscope and Peritoneoscope, apart from Biochemical Autoanalyzers, Blood Gas analyzer, auto cell counter, Somatosensory Evoked Response Testing, Whole Body Spiral CT Scan, 1.5 Tesla MRI scan. Flat panel cath lab, Ultrasonography, Echocardiography, EEG, EMG etc.

DMCH is the only institution in North India which has Intensive Care Units (ICUs) in most of the critical care areas. A new block has been set up which houses Medical ICU, Pulmonary ICU, Stroke ICU, Pediatric ICU, Surgery ICU and Neurosurgery ICU. Other important ICUs are Intensive Cardiac Care Unit (ICCU) in DMCH and Cath ICU and ICCU in Hero DMC Heart Institute. Special care facilities also exist for burns, operated patients, neonates, thalassaemia and cancer patients.

Hero DMC Heart Institute (HDHI), with 120 beds, became operative in April, 2001 and has the state of the art investigative and treatment facilities. The Institute has already performed more than 20,000 catheter laboratory procedures and 3,500 O.T. procedures. The hospital has a spet-CT scan for nuclear medicine & cardiology. It is one of the best cardiac centres in the country.

The institution has well-developed urban and rural health delivery systems, with residential facilities for training of students and interns under the department of Community Medicine. Models for health care delivery and Community Oriented Learning have been developed in these areas in addition to research on community health problems. These have been widely acknowledged.

This institution has come up by the dint of hard work and sincere efforts of the faculty, the management, staff and administrators as also the co-operation of the students. The citizens of Ludhiana and other places have always been kind in extending their helping hand in building up this institution. Above all, the Central and State Governments and many dignitaries deserve gratitude for their co-operation and interest in the development of the College and the Hospital.

### A. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

The institution offers superspeciality, PG degree and PG Diploma Courses with seat distribution as in the Seat Distribution Table.

### B. SELECTION OF CANDIDATES

#### I. DM / MCh Courses

As per item 10 of BFUHS PG prospectus – 2008 (Part A)

#### II. MD/MS/Diploma Courses

##### a. Government Quota :

Candidates for admission to PG Courses will be selected by BFUHS as per procedure laid down in its PGET-2008 prospectus.

##### b. Management Quota (excluding NRI Seats)

1. **Eligibility Criteria :** The candidates must be eligible as per BFUHS PGET-2008 Prospectus Part-A, Item 2 (page 10) and also must **submit the duly completed application form attached to this prospectus by the last date for submission of applications.**

2. **Admission Procedure :**

- (i) *PG Entrance Test :*

Each candidate will have to appear in P.G. Entrance Test-2008 (PGET-2008) to be conducted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in the form and on the date mentioned in its prospectus. Qualifying in PGET-2008 is an essential pre-requisite, but not an entitlement, for selection.

- (ii) *Determination of Merit :*

**Out of the candidates who submit their duly completed application forms to this institution by the due date, the merit of each candidate will be**

determined as per the merit list of PGET-2008 in accordance with the prospectus issued by BFUHS.

(iii) *Course and Discipline :*

Will be determined by the Selection Committee duly constituted from the options available for each candidate during his/her counseling.

**c. Management Quota (NRI Seats)**

1. *P.G. Entrance Test :*

The NRI candidates are not required to appear in PGET-2008 or any other entrance test.

2. *Eligibility Certificate :*

Each candidate must submit, in original, the eligibility certificate from BFUHS.

3. *Determination of Merit :*

*As per directions of BFUHS*

4. *Course and Discipline :*

Will be determined by the Selection Committee duly constituted from the options available for each candidate during his/her counseling.

**d. Management Quota (left over NRI seats, if any)**

Selection will be based on the merit list prepared for item B (II) (b) (2) (iii) of BFUHS PGET-2008 prospectus. The date of counseling will be notified on the institution website [www.dmch.edu](http://www.dmch.edu). The tuition fee, in accordance with Punjab Govt. Notification No. 5/12/2008-3483/1445 dated 17.03.08, will be the Indian Rupee equivalent of the fee notified for the NRI candidates.

**C. ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

**1. Medical Examination**

The admission of each candidate will be subject to the physical and mental fitness of the candidate to the satisfaction of the Medical Board appointed by the Principal. The candidate should be present for the medical examination on the date and at the venue mentioned in the "Admission Calendar."

# All fees, including those mentioned in Indian rupees, are payable in **foreign currency** or through an NRI account overseas or within India under bank certification.

% Left over seats, if any, will be offered to the applicants for Management Quota seats who will be required to pay fee equivalent of these amounts in Indian currency.

\*The matter regarding the fixation of tuition fee for non NRI seats is under consideration of the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh. Pending final judgement of the Hon'ble High Court, an initial *provisional first year tuition fee* of Rs. 3,50,000 Lakh for superspeciality courses, Rs. 2,99,000 Lakh for PG Degree courses in Clinical subjects, Rs. 2,01,250 Lakh for PG Degree courses in Basic Science subjects and Rs. 2,30,000 Lakh for PG Diploma courses, as notified by the Punjab Govt., will be accepted at the time of admission.

However, as per judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the TMA Pai Foundation case and in the PA Inamdar case, an annual tuition fee of Rs. 6.5 Lakh for superspeciality courses, Rs. 4.5 Lakh for PG Degree courses in Clinical subjects, Rs. 1.75 Lakh for PG Degree courses in Basic Science subjects and Rs. 2.50 Lakh for PG Diploma courses has been fixed by the Institution for the admission year 2008.

Each candidate will have to give an undertaking (Appendix D) to the effect that he/she will pay the final fee as fixed by the Institution consequent to the decisions of the Hon'ble Courts.

### **3. Documents**

Before joining the course, the selected candidates shall submit Affidavits as per Appendices A & B and Bank Guarantee (of balance fee) in the prescribed form as per the specimen given in Appendix C of this prospectus.

### **4. Date of Joining**

The candidates shall have to positively join the respective courses on the date stipulated in the "Admission Calendar". If a candidate fails to join by the stipulated date, the seat shall be treated as vacant.

### **5. Leave**

Each student will be allowed 20 leaves per annum.

## **D. CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION:**

All admissions made under the provisions of this prospectus are provisional and are subject to the final approval of the Competent Authority.

Without prejudice to anything contained in the provisions of this prospectus, if any Court/BFUHS/MCI holds the admission of any candidate null and void under any circumstances, such a candidate shall vacate the seat forthwith without claiming any damages etc. from DMCH or its Management.

### **1. Amendment of Provisions**

This prospectus is subject to any change that may be brought about at any time hereafter on the instruction/advice/decision of the Management/competent authorities/courts and none of the candidates shall lay any kind of claim against DMCH or its Management, if he/she is affected in any way.

### **2. Jurisdiction**

In case of any dispute arising out of these rules, the Civil Courts at Ludhiana alone shall have the jurisdiction

## **E. CONDITIONS OF COURSE**

1. Commencement of the courses, training, certification, Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation training, orientation and assignment of duties will take place in the Dumra Auditorium, Dayanand Medical College and Hospital, Tagore Nagar, Civil Lines, Ludhiana as per schedule stipulated in "Admission Calendar".

2. Each PG student, except PG diploma students, shall apply to the Registrar, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot for approval of the subject of his/her thesis. The time of application for approval of the subject of the thesis and the time of submission of the complete thesis will be as per the guidelines of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.
3. **The total period of this course/training is three years (36 months) for DM / MCh as well as MD/MS and two years (24 months) for Diploma** (inclusive of period of examination) as per the guidelines laid down by the Medical Council of India P.G.-2000 regulations.
4. **Each student will be assessed by the concerned department, the Vice Principal/Dean Academics and the Principal every year. The student may be allowed to continue for the subsequent year only if satisfactory performance certificate is issued by the Vice Principal/Dean Academics and is countersigned by the Principal.**
5. The course of those, whose performance is not satisfactory, may be extended beyond the regular period. During this extended period, the concerned person shall not be paid any kind of salary/remuneration/ stipend and shall not be entitled to any residential accommodation. **The accommodation already occupied by him/her shall have to be vacated immediately. No stipend/compensation shall be paid, if the period of course/training is extended beyond the last regular date, under any circumstances.**

#### **F. RESIDENTIAL ACCOMODATION**

1. **Accommodation will be provided only if it is available and if it is required for the hospital services. This will be at the discretion of the Management.**
2. Only single or shared accommodation **as may be available** will be allowed at the time of joining. **Married couples having a child at the time of joining or thereafter shall make their own arrangement of stay outside the hospital premises as they shall NOT be provided any accommodation by DMCH.**
3. Those who are provided accommodation shall have to pay the hostel charges as mentioned in section G.

1. For the use of gadgets like electric press, tea kettle, cooler and fridge etc., a special written permission from the Accommodation Committee/ Incharge will have to be obtained by the concerned student. The use of such gadgets as above, without permission, will be treated as unauthorized and a penalty of will be charged besides confiscation of such gadgets,
2. Air Conditioner (AC) will not normally be allowed to be used. However, in case a **written permission** is granted for the installation and use of the same, the cost of the AC and installation charges, including the cost of all types of material, will have to be borne by the student himself/herself. The maintenance of the Air Conditioner will also be the responsibility of the student. Installation of AC without permission will result in a fine of to be paid by the allottee of the room.

## H. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Fee is not refundable except when candidate is shifted from one college to another through centralized counseling.
2. Hostel Security will be refunded, without interest, on leaving the institution, on submission of the "No Dues" certificate.
3. Before joining a PG Course under either quota, the candidate must submit proof of his/her registration with the Medical Council of India/State Medical Council.
4. The decision of selection committee shall be final and no correspondence will be entertained regarding any such decision.
5. **This is for the information of all candidates that as per Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution.**
